### SUMMARY

Art & Nature Instructors report to the Associate Director of Education & Civic Engagement and are responsible for providing quality visual arts and nature instruction at Camp di Rosa. This active position works with staff to deliver exciting and innovative art experiences that are fun, informative, and inspire the creative potential in participants. Visual art time at Camp di Rosa utilizes media such as painting, clay and printmaking. Art making ideas are generated from the abundant art and nature found at di Rosa. Nature experiences at Camp di Rosa involve activities like fishing, archery, bird watching, hiking, plant and flower identification. Instructors will work side by side with Art & Nature Assistants and Camp Leaders in Training.

### ABOUT DI ROSA

Protected in perpetuity under the Napa County Land Trust, di Rosa features multiple galleries, a sculpture park, and a 35-acre lake, all located on 217 scenic acres in Napa Valley's famed Carneros region. di Rosa originated as the vision of Rene di Rosa (1919-2010), a prolific collector whose famed vineyards enabled his development of a world-class art collection. Together with his wife Veronica di Rosa (1934-1991), he used the sale of his vineyards to build an "art park" for the greater public. The organization was incorporated as a nonprofit public trust in 2000.

Today di Rosa presents contemporary exhibitions by Bay Area-based artists and an array of educational programs for all ages, in addition to maintaining a permanent collection of notable works by artists with ties to the Bay Area from the mid-twentieth century to the early 2000's. ## KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

### General

- With the Art & Nature Assistant, supervise and manage a camp group of similar age children.
- Ensure camper safety during all activities; immediately communicate any safety to camp management.
- Obtain a CPR/First Aid certification and a fingerprint/background check. (Paid by di Rosa.)
- Supervise Art & Nature Assistant, providing concrete direction and feedback as needed.
- Supervise and mentor Camp di Rosa Leaders in Training when they rotate through your group.
- Attend all training sessions and meetings.
- Communicate in a timely manner with Camp di Rosa Director.

### Visual Arts & Nature Instruction

- Lead the set up and break down of your group's art and activity supplies, including daily cleaning and organizing supplies.
- Deliver art lessons and nature activities per Camp curriculum, adjusting fit your groups' interests and individual camper needs.
- Demonstrate leadership through positive contributions to overall camp environment and through participation in all-camp activities.

- Experience providing art instruction to groups of children ages six to fourteen.
- Knowledge of various art mediums and their applications and uses.
- Interest in nature, hiking, and nature-related activities. Ability to walk a minimum of 4 miles daily.

- Resourceful and proactive with proven problem-solving abilities.
